The city has an abundance of historic buildings and monuments in the Gothic architectural style.

Toruń is the Polish city with the second highest number of retained, authentic historic monuments.

The authenticity of the medieval and Gothic skyline of Torun was one of the main arguments supporting the decision to add Toruń to the UNESCO List of World Heritage Sites in 1997.
